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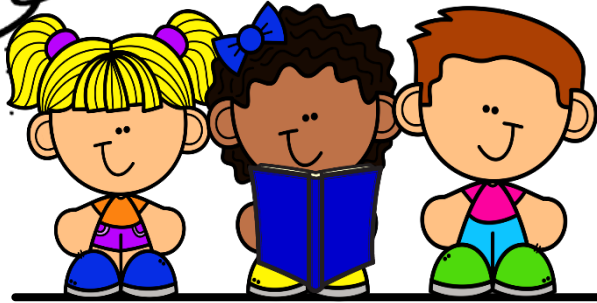
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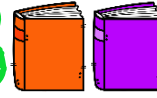
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Give your child plenty of playtime. Some of the best kinds of play are unstructured, when children can use their imaginations and create stories about what they are doing.
